## If you plan to TRAVEL over WINTER BREAK

- You must have a valid DS-2019 with a valid travel signature to re-enter the United States. travel signatures are valid for 1 year or the end of your DS-2019, whichever comes first. If you need a travel signature, contact [jinfo@unt.edu](mailto:jinfo@unt.edu) at least 14 days prior to travel date
- You must have a valid J1 visa stamp to re-enter the United States (unless you are a citizen of Canada).
- You must have a valid passport that has more than 6 months remaining of its validity.

- On April 14, the State Department's Bureau of Consular Affairs announced that its Travel Advisory levels will no longer be automatically correlated with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) COVID-19 Travel Health Notice levels. - DS-2019 Extensions should be submitted to [jinfo@unt.edu](mailto:jinfo@unt.edu) at least 14 days prior to current DS-2019 end date. J-1 Students requiring an extension, must extend for a minimum of 1 year, unless the expected program completion date is sooner.
